

#### What are the criteria for eligibility for compensation?

The person in question must have been stationed in Camp Lejeune:

- Between August 1, 1953 and December 31, 1987
- For more than 30 days
- And Had complications that can be linked to the contaminants

#### Camp Lejeune Justice Act of 2022

This bill created an exception for the rule that pardons the government from being liable for the injury of its service members by allowing service members and their families to bring legal action to seek compensation for by the brought on damages contaminated water of Camp Lejeune.

#### Will this affect my VA benefits?

No, your monthly VA benefits will not be affected by seeking compensation.

#### What damages are sought?

Medical cost, lost economic ability, pain and suffering.

### What are the requirements of the injured party/family?

The individual or family usually has little time devoted to the case. The legal team handles the case, so you can focus your time on therapies and doing what you love.

#### What was in the water?

There were dangerous levels of:

- Trichloroethylene (TCE)
- Tetrachloroethylene (PCE)
- Benzene
- Vinyl Chloride (VC)

#### What are the dangers of exposure?

Common injuries include:

Adult Leukemia Aplastic Anemia\* Birth Defects/Injuries Bladder Cancer Cervical Cancer Esophageal Cancer Kidney Cancer Liver Cancer

Lung Cancer Miscarriage Multiple Myeloma\*\* Ovarian Cancer Parkinson's Disease Renal Toxicity Stomach Cancer Death

Neurobehavioral Effects (e.g. ALS) Other Serious Medical Conditions \*Other Bone Marrow Conditions
